

Each year stray cats come into Panhandle Animal Shelter (PAS). National statistics show only 2% will be claimed by their owners. Many of the cats we receive are healthy, friendly, and likely owned.


Recent studies show:

60% of healthy, likely owned cats will find their way home on their own.


30% will be found by their owners in a neighborhood search.

Cats are **13 times** more likely to return home by non-shelter means.
