POLICY STATEMENT – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

By releasing your cat to PAS you are turning over ownership and all rights to this animal. Once surrendered, PAS will evaluate the animal and determine its adoptability. If it is determined the animal is adoptable, it will be placed out for adoption immediately. PAS is a “No-Kill” shelter but there are times when an animal in our care is deemed unadoptable and will then be considered for euthanasia. Reasons an animal would be considered unadoptable are as follows:

- An animal show signs of aggression and/or unpredictable behavior where if released through adoption poses a safety risk to our community and their pets.
- Animals that show or develop signs of untreatable disease, injury, congenital or hereditary condition that negatively impact the health of the animal or that is likely to adversely affect the animal's health in the future.
